Mipri Alizabeth Haye was born in Richmond Virginia to her parents Capri Scott-Williams and Michael Haye. Mipri was acknowledged throughout her educational journey for her academic achievements. She was always an honor roll student. Mipri was a member of the Girl Scouts of Central and Southern New Jersey and belonged to the TangledWebbb Service Unit's Troop 22054 from 4th grade to 10th grade. While a Junior Girl Scout, she earned the Bronze Award. Mipri was also a member of Jack and Jill of America, Inc.'s Burlington County Chapter from 2010-2014. She graduated Cum Laude from Washington Township High School in 2018 and was the recipient of the Presidential Award.

Upon completion of high school, Mipri enrolled at Rowan University as a full-time student where she studied Criminal Justice. She had a future aspiration to become a Defense Attorney which would have propelled her into a life career goal of becoming a Judge.

Mipri passed away suddenly on July 30, 2020, at the tender age of 20. The Mipri Haye Scholarship was created to commemorate her life and legacy.

A minimum of \$500.00 will be awarded in scholarships to qualified graduating high school seniors. Each scholarship will be paid by The Mipri Haye Scholarship Fund to the student, upon verification that she has been accepted and enrolled in an institution of higher learning. Any graduating high school senior who demonstrates academic excellence, is currently participating in a leadership development program (e.g., the Girl Scouts, Jr. Achievement, Jr. ROTC, sorority youth development program, cotillion, etc.), who has a GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale) or better, and who has applied or been accepted to a college/university to pursue an undergraduate degree in political science, government, public administration, criminal justice, or similar major, is eligible to apply. Other factors that will be considered in awarding both scholarships are financial need, commitment to volunteerism/community service, and overall qualifications, with emphasis on the quality of the final essay.

Instructions for candidates:

- (1) Complete all forms in its entirety. Attach additional pages if required.
- (2) Prepare a letter of introduction, including who you are, your accomplishments to date, family background, and the degree to which you are seeking, and financial need. Provide a summary on how you plan to use the scholarship if selected.
- (3) Provide at least three letters of recommendation prepared on official letterhead as follows: One letter of recommendation must be from a high school teacher, one letter of recommendation from your leadership development program coordinator/adviser, and one additional recommendation from either a volunteer or community service organization coordinator/adviser, current or previous employer or religious affiliate (i.e., pastor, priest, rabbi, etc.) who can attest to your overall qualifications for the scholarship.
- (4) Provide an official high school transcript (or the equivalent, if homeschooled).
- (5) Provide student's name, the complete name and address of the school you will be attending.
- (6) Write a 500-word essay (typewritten in your own words) on the topic "How volunteerism and community service has impacted my life and how will my receipt of the Mipri Haye Scholarship help me to impact my community"
- (7) Submit your completed application and essay by the April 30, 2026, deadline.
- (8) Please note that if you are awarded the scholarship, you will also need to provide your final official high school transcript and verification of enrollment at an institution of higher education no later than August 1, 2026.
